Epiphany

Epiphany is:
The 12th day of the "season of Christmas" falling on January 6th

An epiphany can mean a sudden awareness; it comes from a Greek word meaning 'to show'

They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.' "~Matthew 2:1-6

Pastor Carol's Corner

Music is an important part of our Christmas celebrations. It is at the center of our worship along with the Scripture readings that bring a message of hope and peace that comes in the birth of our Savior.

We usually call the songs we sing during the Christmas season *carols*; they were originally circle dances. During the Middle Ages, carols were used by the church as a teaching tool. The words were important, teaching people about the Christian faith. Some of the carols we sing are very old; some more recent.

On Christmas Eve we sang "O Little Town of Bethlehem" and on Christmas morning during the time slotted for singing of our favorite carols, we sang the same carol, this time to an English folk melody (there are two versions in our Presbyterian Hymnal).

An Episcopal priest from Philadelphia named Phillip Brooks wrote the words to "O Little Town of Bethlehem" in 1868 for the Sunday School program at his church. Several years earlier he had been in the Holy Land at Christmastime. On Christmas Eve he had traveled on horseback from Jerusalem to Bethlehem, passing fields where shepherds would have kept sheep. He worshipped that night at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. Still recalling his arrival in the little town where Christ was born, Phillip Brooks penned a poem. He asked Lewis Redner, the church organist, to write a simple tune for the words.

On Christmas day following our worship service I went to Chapel View, the care facility where my mother is a resident. My brother, sister-in-law, nephew, niece and her husband had already been to church and were there when I arrived. We gathered in the dining room where the residents were finishing lunch. I am not sure who started it but someone in our group started singing a Christmas carol. My mother joined in the singing of the carol and then we sang another and another, my mother never missing a beat or a word in the singing. At some point I realized many of the residents were also singing with our group. As my nephew Brandon commented later in the day, it was one of those unexpected magical moments that just happen. For me it was also a reminder that Christ is present with us wherever we are, bringing peace to our lives.

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie!


Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by.




