Pastor Carol's Corner

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. - Hebrews 13:8

Unless you are under about the age of 30, you likely feel that the past year has flown by. The older we get, the faster time seems to go. A year is gone before we hardly realize it.

One of the traditions people observe with the passing of one year to the next is making New Year's resolutions. There are probably as many jokes as there are resolutions about how quickly those well-intentioned goals are broken. Who knows why people break their resolutions: perhaps the resolutions were unrealistic or simply too hard to follow through. Perhaps the person's heart was not really in the resolution.

Those markers are important, however, that say we have left behind one year and started another. New Year's helps us consider how fast life does go by and consider whether there are other ways we would like to be living our life. Are there changes we would like to make in how we live this coming year?




