The Season of Lent




The word *Lent* comes from an old Anglo-Saxon word for spring. While Presbyterians do not focus on fasting during Lent, we do spend extra time in worship (come for our soup supper and worship on Wednesday evenings), extra giving opportunities (One Great Hour of Sharing offering or collecting food for the local foodshelves), and focusing on personal prayer and Bible study. Pastor Carol's Corner

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." ~Matthew 16:24

The other day I saw a photograph of one of the presidential candidates in the newspaper. The photo caught my attention not so much because of the candidate; there is no shortage of photographs of politicians these days. What made me do a double take were the three crosses visible on the wall behind the candidate. I looked at the caption; no explanation of where it was taken but I knew the photo must have been taken in a church.

If we were asked what one symbol most identifies us as a Christian, I believe we would agree it is the cross. People sometimes wear crosses as fashion jewelry, but more likely a cross proclaims the wearers faith in lesus Christ.

During the weeks of Lent, our Scripture lessons tell of Jesus making his way to Jerusalem and the cross. In the Roman world, the cross was the

primary means of execution. Death on a cross was reserved for the worst of criminals. The cross is a reminder of how our Savior died so we would have life forever with God.

The Book of Common Worship of the Presbyterian Church pictures different types of crosses. Crosses appear in many styles (look around Calvin Church to see how many you can find), but three that have been used for countless generations are pictured below:



Presbyterians are familiar with the Celtic cross, originally found throughout Ireland, Scotland, and Wales. There is a circle at intersection of the crossbeams.



The Jerusalem cross is recognized as a larger cross with four smaller crosses in each quadrant. It reminds us of where the crucifixion took place, outside the walls of Jerusalem.



The anchored cross is also called the mariner's cross. It echoes the words of Hebrews 6:19 — We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...

Check out the crosses in our display in the cabinet in the Fellowship Hall. You can still bring a contribution to include.


EASTER FLOWERS


