

Pastor Carol's Corner

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ~I Corinthians 1:18

Last summer, I spent the final weeks of my Sabbatical weaving. Somewhere along the line in my travels I had picked up a bug and it eventually developed into pneumonia. As I was recovering and regaining strength, a friend gave me a refresher course and I began weaving again. I had not touched my little tabletop loom at all during the years I had been working on my Doctor of Ministry or since, but I rediscovered how much I love weaving. Since my first project many years ago, I have felt that being a weaver requires you to be a bit of an engineer to understand the mechanisms of the loom. You need to be an artist to design colors and fibers and patterns that will work together. You need to

be a mathematician to work out the amounts of fiber for the warp and weft. Finally you need to commit time to weaving the piece. I find hours can slip by when I am weaving; it takes concentration to get the warp threaded and then to follow the pattern correctly. There is a rhythm of the loom and the feel of the fibers that focuses my attention intensely. I continued weaving through the fall and created Christmas gifts using my little loom.

I have long seen weaving as a metaphor for our spiritual journey. I find weaving calming and centering, almost prayerful, like having the presence of God woven into our daily lives. For me weaving is like walking a labyrinth: you don't know where you will end up. Until you cut your project off the loom, you don't know how the whole piece will look, where there might be a visible mistake or what you wish you could change, and yet once the project is off the loom, you cannot go back and make changes.

I am not unique in seeing weaving as being like the walk of faith. Maria von Trapp (yes, that one – whom we first met through the movie Sound of Music), wrote: "It will be very interesting one day to follow the pattern of our life as it is spread out like a beautiful tapestry. As long as we live here we see only the reverse side of the weaving, and very often the pattern, with its threads running wildly, doesn't seem to make sense. Some day, however, we shall understand." She continued that we discover a thread running through our lives that is God.

During Lent I invited people to help create a banner symbolizing how our faith grows and how we are woven together as a community. My thanks to all who contributed fabric, ribbon, braid, string, beads, and time to creating the piece. Terry Olson made a frame (using wood pieces that had once been in the sanctuary), and Pam Vande Vegte and Kathy Berg helped with the actual weaving. Somewhere along the line we realized the weaving was taking the form of a cross, the symbol at the center of our faith.






