Personnel Committee News

John Calvin left Presbyterians a legacy of concern for education. The Reformer, to whom we trace our roots, encouraged all church members to be educated, in part so they could read the Bible. He stressed all clergy be educated so they could provide solid Biblical and theological scholarship for their congregations.

In keeping with his focus, Presbyterians have started schools, universities, and seminaries around the world. His emphasis encouraged churches to do their best to offer Bible classes for children through adults. Prior to being considered for ordination, clergy study for three years at the graduate level and sit for a series of written exams. The contract of every clergyperson serving a Presbyterian Church (USA) congregation includes

a period of at least two weeks for study leave and funds to be used for that purpose, in the belief that ongoing study benefits not only the clergy but also the congregation.

Pastor Carol approached the Personnel Committee with the request to take time in September to join a group of Christians studying the Apostle Paul and the expansion of the church. The "pilgrimage" is heading to Greece to trace the development of the early church, including visits to Thessalonika, Philippi, Delphi, Corinth, and ending in Athens. In the fall season we can all look forward to hearing about the pilgrimage and learning about the travels of Paul.

The Personnel Committee is working to have everything in place during Carol's absence. Ordinarily study leave is taken during the summer, but since this travel is with a group it had to be taken when the trip was offered. Carol will be away September 8-24. One Sunday during her absence the youth who attended Youth Triennium will be reporting. The other Sundays Rev. Doug Potter will be preaching. As always, pastoral care in our pastor's absence will be covered by other clergy and will be well publicized.



It's time to start thinking about back-to-school supplies and hygiene kits! We will assemble these kits for CWS (Church World Service). The kits require -

- Three 70-page wide-ruled spiral bound notebooks (or two 100-page)
- Six new pencils
- One full size eraser
- One pencil sharpener
- One box of 24 crayons
- One 12" ruler
- One pair of blunt-end scissors



The Hygiene Kits for CWS are distributed wherever there is a healthcare disaster. For these kits we need:

- One hand towel and washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb (suitable for thick, coarse hair)
- One nail clipper
- One wrapped bath size bar of soap (no Irish Spring)
- One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- Six standard size Band-Aids ®

All items should be placed in a one-gallon zipper top plastic bag.

The hand towels and washcloths will be provided if others can fill in the remaining items. There are lists by the hand towel display in the Fellowship Hall with the items needed. See Belinda Breit with any questions.




