With Ash Wednesday we enter the season of Lent that stretches all the way to Easter. Lent was first observed in the early centuries of the church. The season is 40 days (Lent does not include Sundays), recalling the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness after his baptism and in preparation for his ministry.

Lent is a time for us to consider more deeply our intention to follow Christ, to recognize our need of God and how we respond to God's call upon our lives.

For many Christians it is a time to let go of obstacles to our commitment to Jesus Christ. The word Lent comes from an Old English word for spring. It works for us living in a northern climate, but it also reminds us of how we can grow in our faith during these 40 days.

Our practice at Calvin during Lent is to add to our daily lives with different spiritual practices during these weeks of Lent.

We gather each Wednesday for a soup supper and worship service. The meal is served by 6:00pm, with worship at 6:30pm, and you are on your way by 7:00pm.

Another Lenten tradition across the church and the centuries is extra giving opportunities. Together with the March MN FoodShare program, we collect for our local food shelves (more info on pg. 5).

We also collect for One Great Hour of Sharing during Lent (see more information on page 5). Blessings on your Lenten journey, $\bigcap_{A \in A} \emptyset$

A group of people have begun working on the establishment of guidelines on how to manage the endowment received from Terry and Jane Olson's estate. Those who have begun that work include Judy Rogosheske, Jay Gagner, and Sharon Corl. They are working with the family's wishes and the desire of Terry and Jane to see their church continue to be sustainable into the future.

The following explains the work of the team to date; it was handed out to the congregation at the annual meeting: The purposes of this endowment fund are as follows. At the request of the Olson Family, \$200,000 of the funds are to go for major building or grounds maintenance and construction. It will be used to solidify, for years to come, one of our greatest assets here at Calvin, our sanctuary/meeting place. The other half of the fund will be used for program support, staffing, development and the long-term support of our great congregation/community, including to help grow the base membership of our congregation so we can be self-sustainable into the future. The family would like to see this implemented over a 20-year period.

The Session approved \$20,000 from this fund pay a portion of replacement of the sanctuary roof. The remaining balance of that expense (\$17,000) be withdrawn as follows: one half from unrestricted memorial funds and one half from the sale of land years ago that was designated for replacement, maintenance or upgrade of the property.

The Session had a retreat at church on Saturday, February 15th including the newest Session members. In an effort to work more effectively as a group, we spent time learning about one another's communication style. We spent time reviewing what it means to be an Elder, how we function as a committee and a review of Robert's Rules of Order. We settled on moving our meeting date to the second Monday of the month and discussed committee assignments.

Donations can be brought to church and placed in the designated area in the Gathering Hall. Cash or check donations should be earmarked for the food shelf.

Greetings from the Music Department! Lent is a unique time in our church calendar: there are so many hymns we love very dearly, and ones which are immediately familiar, but so many of them are in minor keys. It is reminiscent of our time in Advent, but for me, despite often minor keys, Advent feels more positive, as we look forward to the birth of Jesus, rather than anticipating his death and resurrection. I recently read an online description of Lenten hymns this way:

"Scientists call the coastal regions where fresh water and sea water mix an "estuary." Lent is an "estuary" where the bitter tears of sorrow over sin are mixed with the sweet, joyful tears of sins forgiven.

So, as you live life in minor key during this Lenten season – as you sing those sad, somber melodies – make sure you listen carefully to the words. Yes, it is your sins that caused his suffering. That is your punishment which He bore. But He did so willingly in love... When we really listen to the words, we come to realize that the sad, somber songs of Lent are really the happy hymns of heaven."

So, as we explore our Lenten hymns, make sure you look beyond the minor melodies and harmonies, and explore the text: deeply moving, and full of God's love for us.
